

Me a cross Vicar? Surely not in that sense - the angry sense. However, I've realised how many things I do with the cross.

When I first arrived at St. John's, people noticed the cross embroidered on my preaching scarf. They also noticed that I make the sign of the cross in the blessing at Communion services. It's a traditional thing to do, but it isn't done by all vicars.

I've featured the cross in other services, too. It began with illuminating our brass cross with a spotlight for our Week of Prayer for Christian Unity service. After that, for our healing and memorial services, I've laid glass plates out on tables in the form of a cross, inviting people to place their candles on them to make a cross of lit candles. Then at Easter the same tables have carried chocolate bars laid out in the form of a cross.

After one visiting Inspector commented about the lack of crosses to be seen in our School, I asked Colin Priestley to make me one. It now hangs on the wall in the hall as a reminder that ours is a church school with the Christian faith and the cross at the centre of all it is and does. I want one outside the school now - hint, hint! There's room on the wall above the school's name. So watch that space and see if I get my way! If I don't, well maybe I'll be a cross vicar after all!

We've added some more crosses in school - for example an unmissable brightly coloured one in the foyer. The children have also designed and decorated crosses for their classrooms. That's been part of my "design an Easter cross" competition that's being run for the third time this year. It's a delight to see what the children come up with. You'll get the opportunity to see for yourselves as posters featuring the winning designs will be brought into Church on Palm Sunday for Holy Week and Easter.

Combining the candle and the cross, I recently got a special candle with a cross motif on it for use in assemblies at school. I did think about getting one for us to use in church - but held back because it's not the sort of thing that we've had in St. John's for a very long time and I don't want to cause any upset. Such candles haven't been part of my church tradition background, but it seems that I'm growing fonder of the idea!

Evidently, the cross means a lot to me. The cross is a symbol of our faith. The cross is at the heart of Easter and of God's love for us. Yet for many the cross means little. Few people seem to know much about the significance and meaning of the cross.

That seems obvious in the shops. Easter and Christmas are both commercially big business events. At least at Christmas there is some imagery of what it's all about. How little there is at Easter!

I mentioned the new candle with a cross motif for school. In assemblies it's to be a regular reminder of the cross. But the candle has it's own significance, too. Candles were once used for light, before we had gas and electricity. That's what they'd have been used for in churches - for no other purpose than that. Yet they became reminders of the light of Christ shining in the world. Which is why, although we don't need them for light anymore, we still use them in church. It's also the reason why lighted candles are given out in baptism services.

This Easter may the light of Christ shine on you. And may we bring the light of Christ to others, so that they may appreciate, with us, the full significance of the Easter cross.

Joan gave me permission to write this article. I hope it gives you and your family comfort Joan, to know just how much Eddie was thought of and respected. I am sure you will already have realised that though.

There was nothing posh about Eddie. He was just a good solid chap.

# Favourite Hymn by Sylvia Taziker

It has become increasingly difficult to get people to tell us of their favourite hymns/songs! After racking my brains to find an Easter hymn to write about I had virtually given up.

This 'write up' is thus about help I got, not from a member of St.John's, but from a CD which Andrea bought for me two weeks ago when we went to Mold. She went into the bookshop (where else would she go?!) and came out to tell me that she had bought me a CD by one of my favourite singers, Bryn Terfel. Apparently she had heard the CD being played in the shop and asked the lady what it was and she actually turned the CD to another part of track and said to Andrea "it's wonderful! Just listen to this with the choir as they perform with Bryn!"

We played the CD in the car on the way home, I listened to the first piece which was 'What a Wonderful Word' and as this is not one of my favourite songs I read the accompanying leaflet and found out that the accompanying choir was actually the Mormon Tabernacle Choir. It was so interesting that we stopped the CD and I read the information out loud.

I have a few if Bryn Terfel's CD's but this one really beats all. Bryn Terfel is a wonderful Welsh bass/baritone singer, he sings opera worldwide but I love to hear him sing hymns, carols and other sacred music and folk songs, he really makes you feel that he is meaning every word he sings. The prayerful passages are quiet, gentle and peaceful and the jubilant parts are loud and very expressive. The Mormon Tabernacle Choir are unbelievable, this was the first time I had really taken notice of the wonderful tone and depth of their singing. Apparently, according to the leaflet, a group of Welsh pioneer immigrants travelled across America to a remote settlement in the Great Salt Lake Valley in the Rocky Mountains; there they formed a choir led by John Rutter, a minister and musician from North Wales. People enjoyed their singing and they later were asked to form a more permanent ensemble and this actually formed the nucleus of what was to become the Mormon Tabernacle Choir.

The Choir itself has 360 members aged from 25 (it used to be aged from 30) who can only be in the choir for twenty years of participation or until they are 60. They also have to live a certain distance from the centre of Salt Lake City where the church is to make sure that they will be able to attend all practises and performances.

We played the CD all the way home and I have never been known not to gabble for most of the time but I just got so caught up in this marvellous music that I hardly spoke a word. I just cannot tell you about all the pieces but we know most of them and they are all superb. I will never sing "Guide Me O Thou Great Jehovah" again without giving it a great deal of thought I heard it in a completely different light. We sung along with everything we knew. 'The Battle Hymn of the Republic' had a different tempo to the one we sing and the sound that the choir make is quite amazing, you feel as though you can see the marching men. I feel that in future hymns, songs and sacred music will have an even greater meaning to me than ever. Although I do always try to put meaning and feeling into my singing I will try to do better after hearing these sung with such passion and faith.

The little booklet says that when asked where the original group had learned to sing and who had taught them John Rutter said "The hills of Wales were the schoolhouse, and the Spirit of God was the Teacher."

# Women's World Day of Prayer

The Women's World Day of Prayer took place here at St John's on Friday 7th March.

This year was on Egypt and entitled - Streams in the Desert. And as you can gather from this title, was all about water.

Under the guidance of Ann Haigh, the church was decorated with various displays to give an Egyptian feel to the church.

The symbolic service was done very well by everyone:

The four 'Egyptian women' processed in with four helpers (all suitably attired in Egyptian dress) to lovely Egyptian music, and took us through the service with actions and words.

We had the reading from Isaiah and the story of the Samaritan woman at the well.

The address was given by Sheila Radford and well received by the congregation.

There were hymns, prayers and of course Egyptian music with refreshments afterwards and a chance for fellowship.

None of this would have been possible without Ann's leadership and guidance, and we give our thanks to Ann. Thanks also to the ladies from St John's who took part in the service, the ladies behind the scenes who helped set up the church, baked, served, cleared away and tidied the church afterwards. Also, the ladies from St Georges, St Stephens and Methodist churches who all played their part here at St John's.

Thanks to Mike who sorted the music for us and of course Alan our organist, who plays for us at these events.

Attendance was a little disappointing this year but many thanks to those who managed to make it. You helped make it a really lovely service.

We hope to see more of you at our Women's Rally in May.







# Hansi and Kath Jain.

Every week in our Sunday services at St. John's we pray for those who spread God's message around the world. One couple we pray for is Hansi and Kath Jain.

Last year about this time we reported that Kath, with her daughter Anu, was to visit the UK to talk about their work. Due to travel difficulties this was not possible but hopefully they will be coming in April and May this year.

Hansi, Kath and Anu live in Nagpur, a city situated in the centre of the sub-continent of India. Their organisation is called **Inheritors**.

**Inheritors** run several projects. One is a school, Emmanuel School. This aims to provide education for the Naari who live in the slums of Nagpur. Another project is to give Bible based teaching of family values to people of all ages. The third project is to help women recognise and use their potential through teaching and training.

Hansi's work involves travelling extensively to teach at seminars and provide counselling. Recently he asked for prayers as he addressed parents at the International Children's Academy in Nagpur. None of these parents share his faith at present. From this has come another request for future seminars in the Sindhi community. Kath has been running the school and the office in Nagpur. Anu their daughter works for Inheritors now. They have a son, Sunny who is married to Sheetal and they are both doctors. Their son Shanay was born in May 2011 so Hansi and Kath have become grandparents since we last saw them at St. John's. Another baby is on the way.

Hansi and Kath value our prayers and we ask that you continue to pray for them as they strive to give God's Message to those they meet. Their organisation relies soley on donations from Christians around the world.

Hansi has visited St. John's many times and on the last two occasions Kath has accompanied him. The good news is that Kath and Anu hope to be with us at St. John's on **Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> May** at our morning service. Their work is varied and very interesting. Please come and meet them and learn about the work they do and the future plans they have.

As they serve the people of India they are secure in the knowledge that God will provide for them and protect them. Their Inheritors leaflets contain this text from Jeremiah 29 verse 11.

"For I know the plans I have for you", declares the Lord. "Plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future".




# **NEW I-PADS**




